1. Approve meeting minutes of August 7, 2024 – Motion to approve with corrections by Rich, Second by Lori. Approved.

2. Update from Yuba County Fire Chiefs Association –

- Multiple fire districts have purchased general equipment. Smartsville has purchased GIS equipment. Dobbins and Foothill have purchased type 3 and 6 apparatus. Linda fire has purchased apparatus. Olivehurst Fire purchased radio equipment and **PPE** equipment.

3. Update from Yuba County Departments –

- Probation: Measure K funded Probation Officer position manages homeless case load working with other Yuba County departments. Substance Abuse Counselor in teen center has had positive impact. Seeing 160% increase in case load with predictions of Prop 36 causing case load to increase further. Intervention Counselor at teen center for domestic violence classes and helps coordinate individuals through probation. Probation aid. Measure K funds have added numerous upfront service. Victim advocate oversees 120 cases and is critical for Victim Services.

Institution: LCSW family therapist. Increased RN services from previous FY. Peer support program (shared with sheriff and DA) available to both staff and public. Starting K9 program with Measure K one-time funds for the canine and vehicle. Probation budget will cover ongoing cost of the K9.

- DA: Measure K has funded two (2) attorneys, one (1) investigator, one (1) systems analyst. Systems analyst will be shared by DA and Sheriff and will be beneficial to make sure information isn't input multiple times in the different systems. Clint hopeful to have dashboards and outcomes within the year to report back on.
- Sheriff: Sheriff's Office Measure K funded positions: Twenty-Six (26) positions throughout seven (7) different departments. Sheriff's office has invested heavily in technology including new cad system, license plate readers, cameras for jail facility, new RMS and JMS system. Sheriff's Office will be utilizing Systems Analyst to help with capabilities of both systems. Sheriff's Office was able to purchase 3.5 acres of land for Animal Control Services (ACS) to allow ACS to expand their facilities. Purchased software required to receive information from privately owned cameras – joint effort with CDSA. Will allow SO to receive the live footage from other locations such as Costco, school districts, etc. Measure K purchased deputy cell phones to help aid with RIPA requirements and makes it more efficient to report information to CAD system. Was 5–8-minute process, now more instantaneous. Retention is doing well, in part to being more up to date with technology. Consolidated Dispatch still ongoing project, as there are many moving parts and funding aspects that need to align to make it a successful project.
- CDSA – Code Enforcement: Measure K funds have placed two full-time deputies from the Sheriff's Department that are assigned to Code Enforcement. Code Enforcement employees are also able to bill for Measure K projects – backup documentation for transparency available. General abatement is doing well. Measure K helped fund the Grey's Beach cleanup and Feather River setback issues. Measure K funding purchased equipment for hand crew to help with cleanup projects. Measure K Committee members invited to view the annual report to the Board of Supervisors on February 25, 2025.

4. Continue review of Yuba County Measure K activity

- No expenditures in Period 13. OES received a credit from CalFire for Consolidated Dispatch services for overbilling in previous fiscal year. May and 4th Quarter Cleanup

Revenues - \$2.1 million received in revenue which was split between fire and county. These revenues helped offset the RIMS implementation.

5. Review future meeting dates

Next meeting scheduled for August 6, 2025. Will be financial update meeting.

6. Committee Member comments

New committee member Randy Mitchell welcomed by Fred. Randy is a local business owner who has been involved in the local community for over fourteen (14) years. He has a passion for community involvement and leading by example. Commends Measure K for the positive impact it has had on the community. Lori thanked departments for the information presented. Notes that Measure K funding has benefitted the community. Lori mentioned that she is happy to see the Peer Support Program being utilized, as it is an extremely positive program. Rich notes that he is appreciative of the department efforts and enjoyed hearing the updates from Probation and Code Enforcement. Gave accolades to all departments.
